We are very pleased to have the Reverend Dr. George Peters giving the sermon for our worship services while Pastor Fred is on vacation. Dr. Peters will be joining us this Sunday, July 12th and next Sunday July 19th.

Dr. Peters graduated from Bates College in 1969, Andover Newton Theological School in 1973 and earned his doctorate of ministry at Hartford Seminary in 1981.

Dr. Peters, who was ordained in 1973 in his hometown church in Columbia, Connecticut, joined the Pawtucket Congregational Church in 1982 and served there until 2011. The Pawtucket Congregational merged with Sayles Memorial Congregational Church and is now called the Chapel Street Congregational Church in Lincoln, where Dr. Peters serves as Pastor Emeritus.

Dr. Peters has served on many boards and committees, often in leadership roles. He is the Past President of the Rhode Island Conference, United Church of Christ and currently serves as the Chair of the Board of Trustees at Newman Congregational United Church of Christ in Rumford, RI.

Dr. Peters served as our bridge pastor last fall and it is a joy to have him back.

When Martin Luther, the Father of the reformation, was dealing with The Black Death plague, he wrote these wise words that can help inform the way we approach things happening in our world right now...

"I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance inflict and pollute others and so cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me and I have done what he has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others. If my neighbor needs me however, I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely as stated above."

What began as a small group of sewers at PDCC making dresses for Haiti, turned into an expanded group of 18 women sewing masks to meet the needs of the Coronavirus Pandemic. Four of our Church members, Katherine Condon, Paula Campbell, Kerry McCarty and Sarah Algie joined others from our community.

They shared materials, delivering duties and even sewing machines and as of this time, over 1900 masks have been delivered to organizations. Those include RI Hospital, SC Hospital, SK Fire Department and Police Departments, Hope Valley Ambulance, various nursing homes and medical facilities, and many other local churches, stores and businesses. More than 50 masks have been made for PDCC folks in addition to supplying their own families and friends.

This has been an ongoing labor of love and a camaraderie has grown among the women who virtually share laughter and tears, songs and pictures, and friendship.
