# One Great Hour of Sharing – Easter Sunday Mission Collection

On Easter Sunday in 1949, on nationwide radio, Christians were challenged to donate one million dollars in one hour to help people devastated by the aftermath of World War II. Faithful Christians answered the challenge and the goal was met. That was the beginning of the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering. This year marks the 75th Anniversary. Our world has changed since 1949, but human needs remain. Each year, the OGHS offering gathered by several denominations and Church World Service (CWS) continues to carry God's message of love and hope to people in crisis.

Since that first offering, OGHS has expanded its mission to support domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravaged by national disaster, advocate and offer resettlement assistance for refugees and displaced persons, and combat injustice in its many forms.



OGHS provides funding and hands-on assistance in collaboration with local and international partners that fund health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries and both international and domestic disaster response. Alarmingly, 25% of our meals currently go to folks who are receiving only one meal. This leads us to the conclusion that many are eating alone. Some

have expressed interest in a dine-in opportunity. We have volunteers expressing a desire to do more....

Participation in the Tuesday Bistro does not impact eligibility for Wednesday and Friday meals. The Bistro is an added feature for those looking for a more social dining experience.

# March Mission of the Month: Egg-a-Day Haiti



A chance meeting on the flight back from Haiti to New York after Hurricane Sandy led two women to discover a common concern: the hungry children they had

seen during their visit. By the time the plane landed, the two had vowed not only to find a way to feed the children but were determined to find a way to help the Haitians in the communities they serve become self-sufficient and produce their own food.

That was the birth of the Egg-a-Day Nutrition Program (formerly known as OneEgg Haiti) which has, since 2013, provided high-quality animal protein in the form of a hard-boiled egg to over 2500 children throughout Haiti. The goal is to make the program sustainable by educating individuals, especially school children, about how to raise their own food and chickens.

That had been happening, for the most part, until a few years ago when the already poverty-stricken country was plunged into chaos with the assassination of their president. Now, dangerous gangs control much of the country making it even more difficult to find or purchase food. But UCC contacts still have a few chicken farms and are able to deliver eggs to some schools and orphanages.

Egg-a-Day is funded by donations from churches and individuals in our conference. For several years,

those donations were supplemented by additional financial support from OneEgg.org, a charitable organization that ran a similar program in Africa. However, that organization is no longer in operation. Egg-a-Day relies solely on donations from individuals and churches. It does not take much - \$60 will feed a child an egg a day for one year.


