Youth Connect will start on September 17.

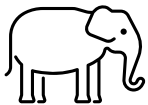
Family Sundays: September 24 and October 22. There is no Youth Connect on FAMILY SUNDAYS, but ALL ages are welcome to join in the fun!

Plastic Recycling Request

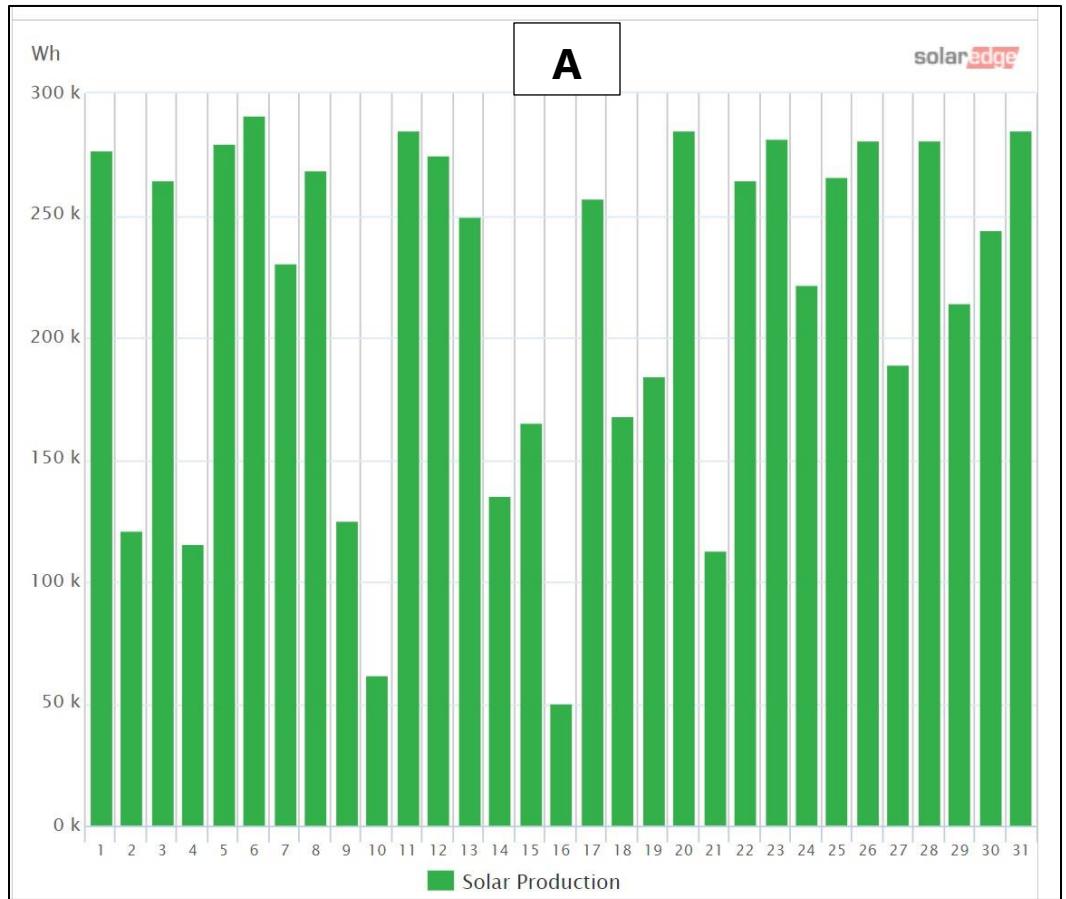

PDCC Solar Update

Prior to our solar installation in 2021, the church's electricity use was about 51,760Kw/year. At a cost of \$0.27 per kilowatt hour, our usage totaled about \$13,975. For the present year we estimate our cost will be \$3,400, or approximately \$10,575 less than the pre-solar projection. This does not account for the probable 30% increase in electricity projected for this winter. Nor does it consider that we were operating at only 2/3 efficiency for part of this year due to a failed inverter.

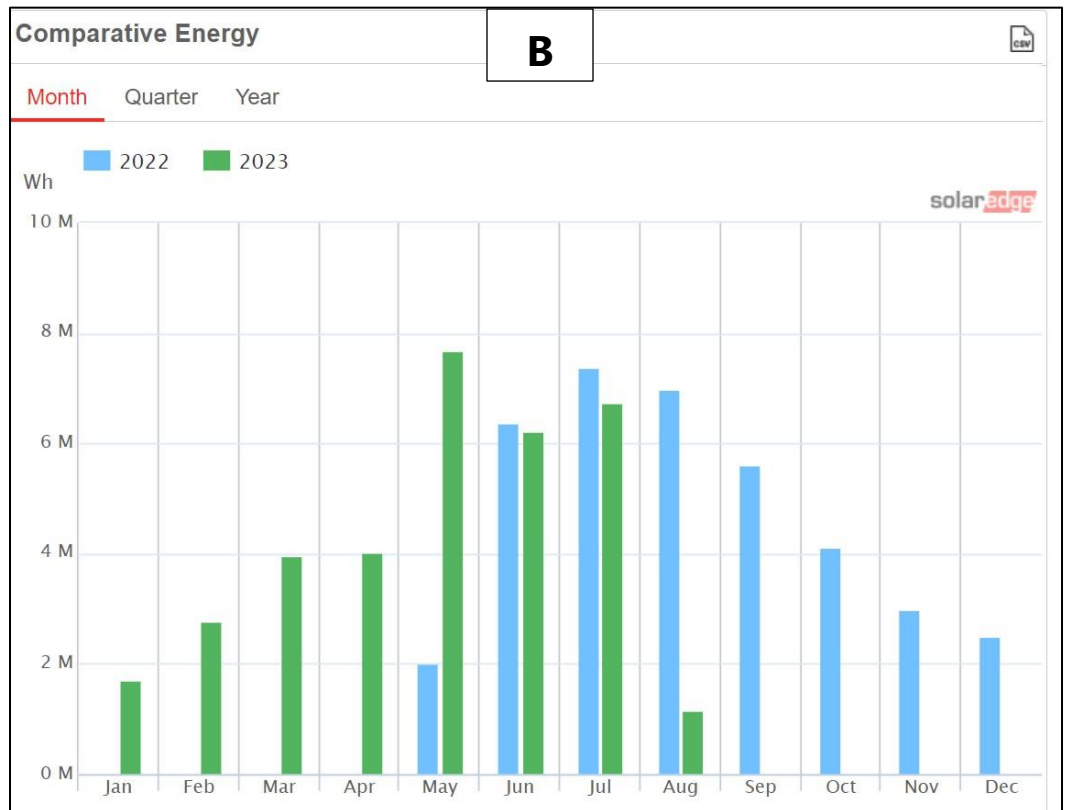
Graph A shows production for July 2023. Low output during cloudy days, but very productive during others.



Graph B shows energy generated since installation through August 5, 2023.

Clearly the solar project has been a boon for the environment and for the church finances. Our savings will permit us to support other mission activities as well as feeling confident that we have made a small contribution to the climate change issue.

August Mission: Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Replacing or patching a roof, performing plumbing or electrical repairs,

building a wheelchair ramp, repairing a porch or steps, fixing a window - all of these can make a real difference to our neighbors in need. Necessary home repairs are often not addressed when homeowners are faced with stretching their paycheck, disability check, or Social Security income. In some cases, completing this work is the only way homeowners are able to stay in their homes and remain independent.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors Rhode Island (NHNRI) provides home repairs at no cost to low-income qualifying homeowners in South County, RI, enabling families to safely remain in their homes.

NHNRI was established in 2012 as a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization. We are a 100% volunteer organization without paid staff, administrators, or physical office space of our own, so we work in the most cost-effective way possible, operating with an absolute minimum of overhead costs.

Because we have low-overhead expenses, funds raised are predominantly applied to the cost of building materials, necessary liability insurance for our volunteers and Board of Directors, and hiring licensed contractors when required.

The work has changed over time from volunteer labor to professional contractor labor. This was driven in part by the COVID pandemic, but also to satisfy requirements of the towns in which we work to use licensed contractors and obtaining building permits.

The types of projects we accept vary, and the homeowners we serve are diverse. The common element is that these homeowners cannot afford to perform essential repairs that are necessary for them to be able to stay in their homes.

Our vision is to eradicate homelessness in South County, RI by repairing one home at a time. A home repaired also means lives repaired, possibly even saved.

Why? About 11.4% of Rhode Island's population lives in poverty according to the 2020 census. About 31% of Rhode Islanders experienced food insecurity in 2022. NHNRI exists to ensure that South County families have a roof over their heads and do not have to make the choice between eating this week or completing a necessary, and in some cases urgent, home repair.

How? When a homeowner submits an application, our volunteers first determine eligibility for assistance and then evaluate the need to determine the best course of action. When repairs are required to be provided by a licensed contractor, our volunteer project managers become the single point of contact between the homeowner and the contractor who is paid directly by NHNRI.

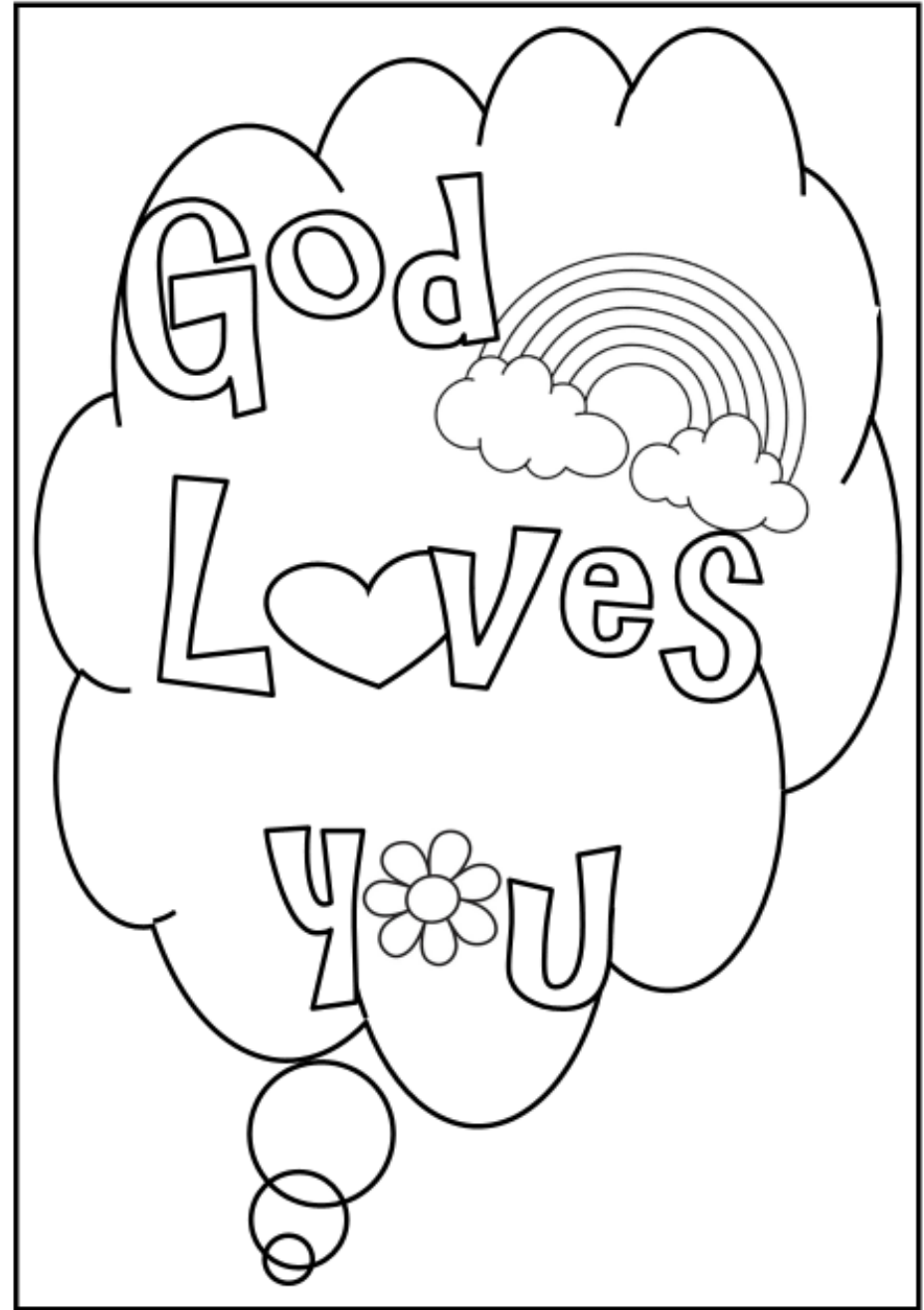
