As part of our ongoing commitment to caring for God's creation, Peace Dale Congregational Church is taking new steps toward environmental stewardship.

In partnership with the PDCC Green Team, our Hospitality Team is introducing more sustainable products into our Fellowship gatherings and daily use.



This transition will take place in phases. We will begin by replacing our current supplies with compostable coffee and cold cups along with compostable plates and napkins. To support these changes, we will be placing new bins for compostable items as well as bins for recycling in Fellowship Hall.





Notices will be posted with updated information for commercial composting and recycling. This will make it easier for everyone to participate in reducing waste and ensuring items end up in the right place.



You may also notice changes beyond Fellowship Hall. Our bathrooms will soon be stocked with recycled paper hand towels, and we are actively exploring additional opportunities to replace conventional paper products with environmentally friendly alternatives.

By taking these steps, we are both reducing our environmental footprint and setting an example of care for creation for our wider community. We invite all members and friends of PDCC to celebrate this progress, support these efforts, and join us as we continue to find new ways to live out our shared commitment to God's earth.

Our vision is a community without hunger and poverty where everyone can reach their full potential and improve their quality of life. For 50 years, Jonnycake Center has consistently met the basic needs of our neighbors when they need it most. We distribute healthy food, provide safe housing, and engage and support young people so that everyone in our community has the opportunity to thrive. Our team delivers compassionate and confidential one-on-one support to every person who walks through our door to connect them with every available resource. In June of this year, we opened a youth center where our thrift store used to be.

We serve more than 2,200 people each year and the demand continues. Visits to our food pantry are up 80 percent since 2022.

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders and Strategies

Nov. 5 at Peace Dale Congregational Church in Wakefield from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Although FASDs are twice as common as autism, these disorders often go undiagnosed or misdiagnosed. Children, adolescents and adults with FASDs have invisible brain injuries. Typical parenting, teaching and therapeutic strategies are often ineffective. Undiagnosed FASDs may cause students to struggle in school.

"It is vital for anyone parenting, teaching or working with these individuals to understand the reasons behind learning and behavioral challenges and have effective strategies to manage these neurobehavioral differences," said Enid Watson, former FASD state coordinator.

FASDs are a group of diagnosable medical conditions that can occur in a person who was exposed to alcohol before birth. Effects are lifelong and can include mental health conditions, learning disabilities, sensory issues, and physical effects such as heart defects, problems with hearing, seeing, and more.

This community meeting will include presentations by experts in the field including Reuben Kittrell, FASD services coordinator at the Institute for Health and Recovery; David Chronley, MD; Kristen Eriksen, RN; and Matthew Malek, MD.

"This opportunity will provide in-depth crucial information about FASD and how we can all do our part in supporting individuals and families impacted by this disability," Watson said.

Prenatal alcohol exposure is a leading cause of birth defects in the United States. Although in the US, FASD affects an estimated 1 in 20 people, this disorder often goes undiagnosed or misdiagnosed.

The Rhode Island Department of Health supports efforts to raise awareness about the critical importance of prevention, early intervention, and treatment related to alcohol use during pregnancy and fetal alcohol spectrum disorders.

Afterward, we will send the collected ideas and suggestions to the Global Ethical Stocktake (GES) Circle which is gathering the key points of these dialogues taking place all over the world and will present them to the national leaders at COP30.

We will focus on the following questions prepared by the GES:

- 1. Why do we continue with production and consumption models that harm the most vulnerable and are not aligned with the 1.5°C Mission?
- What ideas and values could inspire to mobilize more people, leaders, corporations, companies, and nations to combating the climate crisis?
- 3. What traditions, histories, or practices (cultural, spiritual) from your community teach us to live in greater harmony with nature? How can we mobilize more people?
