Many of you may remember that Kathy Carland spoke to us in early November about The Domestic Violence Resource Center of South County, a non-profit that is making an important difference in the lives and futures of many women and children here in South County.

From their webpage:

"The Domestic Violence Resource Center (DVRC) of South County is a Trauma-Informed Agency whose main focus is to help victims of domestic violence break the cycle of abuse in their lives. Each department, Advocacy, Case Management, and Counseling are all here to provide resources, guidance, and support to help victims get to safety, become independent, and heal."

"The DVRC is working to change the social norms that contribute to the continuance of violence. Our goal is to help a victim break the cycle of violence and heal in order to have healthy relationships in the future."

"DVRC provides a comprehensive range of services for victims of domestic violence and their children, including a confidential Safe Home, Transitional Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing units, a Helpline & Drop-In Center, Support Groups, One-on-One Counseling and Court Advocacy."

## Maximize Your Clothing Donation

The New York Times Wirecutter recently published an article containing recommendations for responsibly donating unwanted clothing and shoes. Some excerpts from the article are provided below, or you may read the full article at <https://www.nytimes.com/wirecutter/guides/how-to-get-rid-of-old-clothes/>

If you're starting the new year looking to organize your closets and downsize your clothing collection, Tabitha's Closet would gratefully accept donations and offers the following guidelines to make our work efficient.

Please resist the temptation to throw everything in one bag and drop off to us

Please carefully inspect each item. Items should be clean and free of stains, tears and pet hair. Separate the wearable clothes by type and label bags for easier sorting on our end.

Stained and damaged items should be set aside for [repurposing](#) or [textile recycling](#).

Everything you donate should respect the potential future recipient. Garments that don't make someone feel good—or wouldn't fetch any money if they were resold—are unlikely to find a second home. If you don't want it because it is stained, damaged or worn out—it's very likely no one else will. Our experience over the first year at Tabitha's is nearly 25% of donations do not meet our quality threshold.

If you have seasonal items to donate, it's best to hold on to them until the time of year when they'll be usable. So if you have extra winter coats, please wait until late fall to donate them. And save short-sleeved and lighter-weight items for springtime.

Taking these steps helps ensure that your garments are going to people who need them, but also spares the volunteers sifting through donations from having to throw away or find another home for the items that do not meet our standards.

**DONATIONS.** Tabitha's will be accepting winter clothing donations through February 1st. We ask that all donations be paused for the month of February while we offer our final winter inventory. We will be accepting spring/summer clothing donations beginning March 1<sup>st</sup>.

We ask that donations be laundered and delivered in a clean bag, as we don't have a washer/dryer. See [peacedalechurch.org](http://peacedalechurch.org) for a list of what we do and do not accept.

**Please help us collect supplies!** This is an annual mission of PDCC and with the help of our congregation, we have increased the number of kits processed each year. These kits are sent to areas around the world where natural disasters have occurred. **Please add these items to your shopping lists and leave them in boxes provided in Fellowship Hall.** We have found these items in Job Lot, Wal-Mart and Dollar Tree. Thank you for your help in making another successful year providing kits for Church World Service's world-wide mission.

### Supplies needed

#### HYGIENE KIT

- Wash cloth
- Wide-tooth comb
- Fingernail or toenail clipper
- Bath-size bar of soap in wrapper
- Toothbrush in original package
- Ten standard size band-aids

#### SCHOOL KIT

- Rounded tip scissors
- 70-count spiral notebooks
- 12-inch ruler
- Hand-held pencil sharpener
- Large eraser
- Six pencils
- 24-pack crayons

## I Buy Raise Right Gift Cards Because...

No cost to me – benefit to PDCC!

Heads up – I buy Raise Right Gift Cards on Sunday after worship from the Raise Right table in Fellowship Hall – run by Deb Shaw, Cindy Dowgiallo, and whoever is helping that week.

If I buy a card for Belmont, they give back 10% to the church; Shaw's gives 4%, and so forth.

I am not a shopper, but just for groceries I was able to give to the church through this program approximately \$180. Can you imagine if 100 families did the same, it would increase our church funds by \$18,000 a year.

Some of the give backs:

- Shaw's – 4%
- Stop and Shop – 3.5%
- Belmont's – 10%
- Dave's – 5%
- Walmart – 2.5%

I could have also gotten cards for home goods, electronics, restaurants, or clothing where the return on cards through raise right was even higher. LLBean – 16%, Starbucks – 4.5% to mention a couple of examples but this time of year they increase the percentage. Stop and Shop card can be used for groceries or gas.

The best thing is that it didn't cost me anything!! I just had to remember to bring my check book to church Sunday and take a few minutes to get the cards.

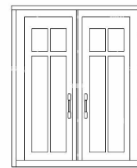
