May Mission of the Month: Shower to Empower

Restoring Dignity. Building Trust. Creating Pathways Forward.



Imagine going days – or weeks – without a shower. No clean clothes. No place to shave, wash your hair, or simply feel human. For those living unsheltered in Rhode Island, this is daily life.

But dignity can arrive on wheels.

Launched in 2018 by House of Hope CDC in partnership with Team Williams and the City of Providence, Shower to Empower is a one-of-a-kind mobile outreach program that brings compassion, care, and connection to people experiencing homelessness—right where they are.

Our 20-foot mobile unit travels five days a week to Providence, Woonsocket, Pawtucket, and West Warwick. At every stop, it offers more than just hot showers. It offers hope - haircuts that renew confidence, medical navigation that restores health, basic necessities that remind people they are not forgotten, and case management and street outreach that open doors to shelter, treatment, and housing.

For someone sleeping in a tent, car, or under an overpass, a warm shower can mean the world—a moment to feel clean, seen, and cared for. But Shower to Empower is about more than hygiene. It's about trust. It's about connection, and it's about change.

Through daily interactions with our team, we meet people in their most vulnerable moments—with no judgment and no conditions. It's this consistent, compassionate presence that helps guide individuals from crisis to stability, from the streets to housing, from surviving to truly living.

Since its launch, Shower to Empower has delivered over 10,000 showers, 1,800 haircuts, and 2,300 medical services—but the true impact goes far

beyond the numbers. Each act of care is a seed planted – seeds that grow into new beginnings.

Help us continue this work.

Help us empower change—one shower, one haircut, one conversation at a time. Your support can restore dignity. It can rebuild trust. It can help change a life.

Sabbatical and Vacation

Hello, my faith family! I have some news to share with you. During a portion of the summer months, I will be taking some sabbatical leave. You may be asking, why do ministers take sabbatical leave? According to the UCC – (2024 Clergy Compensation Guidelines for the SNEUCC) - "Sabbatical, leave offers a time of sustained study, travel, and personal and professional renewal, enabling ministers to be of greater service within their ministry setting over time." This section on sabbatical leave also says, "To meet conference guidelines a church should offer 12 weeks of paid sabbatical leave every five years." (It's bolded in the guidelines.) I plan to take a total of 7 weeks sabbatical leave during the summer months beginning on June 19th (I took some leave time in 2022).

Some Sabbatical Plans are as follows:

As part of the Green Team's efforts of helping our church become a Green Church we are now sometimes incorporating prayers that allude to and/or are related to environmental stewardship. During my sabbatical I will be putting together a collection of prayers, written by others or by myself, for use during worship services, as environmental stewardship prayers. My goal will be to compile a collection of 30 such prayers.

Hopefully this will help us focus on our goal of becoming a green church, and ultimately help facilitate our mission of being called by Christ to create shalom and justice for all (including All creation).

Also, during my sabbatical, I hope to speak with representatives of at least 5 Green Teams from the UCC and/or other denominations. I plan to visit some of the churches I am contacting. Hopefully this will yield some information about what other churches are doing in terms of environmental stewardship, and/or what they are doing in terms of creation justice. I wonder, if in these churches, the Green Team functions as the Creation Justice Team? Do they see it all as basically the same thing? Do they see their own efforts contributing to creation justice ministries? What do they hear our "still speaking God" saying to them and through them?

I have registered for an event on 6/21/25 at Wolfe's Neck Center for Agriculture and the Environment in Freeport Maine entitled "Green Teams Gathering". It's organized by the BTS Center - "Spiritual

Leadership for a Climate-Changed World". You can find out more about that through this link - thebtscenter.org/green-teams-gathering-2025/. Are you interested in joining the green team and coming too? You can register for the event through that link.

Coverage during this time

In addition to my sabbatical, I will also be taking 4 weeks of vacation time. This all adds up to me being away from the church/out of the pulpit, from June 19-Sept. 4. But don't worry, the Deacons have a plan! They are assigning one Deacon per pastor/speaker and they will connect with them to help facilitate the pulpit coverage during my absence. The Rev. Steve Sayer and The Rev. Enid Watson will be handling emergency pastoral care calls and funerals during this time – Rev. Sayer will be on call from June 19 – July 7 and Rev. Watson will be on call from July 7 – Sept. 4. You can reach them through the church office and you can also find their phone numbers in Breeze and contact them directly.

By the way, Pastor Emeritus, The Rev. Dr. Larry Washburn will be in the pulpit on 2 of the Sundays while I'm on leave.

Coming Back...

After I return, I plan to have the above-mentioned prayers to share with you, as well as some information and hopefully some good ideas that I will have gathered from talking with Green Team members from other churches. Thank you to the Executive Board, thank you to you, PDCC - our faith family, for allowing me this sabbatical leave. I do appreciate it! And of course, I appreciate the vacation leave I will be taking as well.

May God bless us during the time we will be apart. Hopefully you will benefit from having others in the pulpit, and we will all find some sabbath rest this summer. May this experience rejuvenate us personally and help motivate/inspire us in terms of our mission, "to create shalom and justice for all" - especially when it comes to Environmental Stewardship and Creation Justice.

Good-Bye Weeds!



For those of you who are following the ecologically beneficial practices of invertebrate habitat sustainability, the caterpillars, bees, and especially birds thank you. By leaving those leaves and flower stems on your beds

until we have a sustained period of 50 degrees in the evening for a week, the insects have a safe place to rest until the cycle of renewal begins once again.

In keeping with a safe environment for all creatures including human beings, there is another practice we can follow for those pesky weeds that crop up in our walkways and driveways. (did you know you can eat many of them when they are young and tasty ... but that's for another time.)

An easy to make, inexpensive, non-toxic solution appropriately called "organic" Roundup can be used to kill them. But as it is non-selective, care must be exercised not to let it come in contact with desired plants or grasses. The most effective application method is to apply on a still, warm sunny day. The weeds should yellow and die within a number of hours.

Make sure to completely wet the leaves and then apply to the center of the plant. This will not kill the seeds so expect that you will have to reapply as new weeds emerge.

NON-TOXIC ROUNDUP

1 Gallon white vinegar
1 ¼ cups salt
2-3 Tbsps. dish detergent
Add vinegar and salt to large pot.
Bring to low-medium heat, enough to dissolve salt.
Add dish detergent.
Cool to room temp.
Fill spray bottle.
Good-bye weeds!
