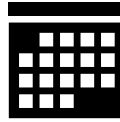
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Tolling of the Bells: 9/11 Remembrance

We are about to begin a very important new chapter in the life of Peace Dale Congregational Church. Our campaign theme is "**Fulfilling the Promise.**"

We have all inherited something very special — a beautiful, historic church that has been a place of worship, fellowship, service, and community for generations. Now it is our turn to care for this building and to ensure that it continues to serve God's purposes and our community for generations to come.

Our beloved building needs significant repairs and improvements. At the same time, we have an opportunity to strengthen our outreach by updating our kitchen and work areas, making it easier for our wonderful volunteers to continue and expand the important work they do through Dinner Table and Bistro.

So, this isn't simply about repairing a building. **It is about preserving our heritage, strengthening our ministry, and preparing our church for the future.**

Our campaign goal is to raise **\$2 million** to make these projects possible, and we are inviting every one of you to be part of making that vision a reality.

September Mission of the Month: Rhody Outpost

URI students are an important part of our South Kingstown community, and we are happy to support this critical program: Rhody Outpost.

Did you know that up to 25% of students at the University of Rhode Island struggle to meet their basic needs?

Rhody Outpost is URI's pantry for any student experiencing basic needs insecurity. The Outpost provides fresh and non-perishable food and personal care items at no charge to students.

Formed as a collaboration between URI and St. Augustine's Episcopal Church in 2012, the pantry is managed by the Dean of Students Office and staffed by student and community volunteers. Rhody Outpost is open two afternoons each week, year-round, serving about 80 students weekly, with a majority being from the international graduate student population.

There are also 10 "Little Rhody" mini-pantries around the university, including one each on the Narragansett Bay Campus and the RI Nursing Education Center in Providence. "Our mission is to remove basic needs barriers to student success in school and in life! Our vision is a URI community with No Ram Hungry!" Read more at <https://web.uri.edu/rhody-outpost/>

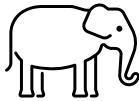
