We will remember throughout the arc of Jesus' life that he was a mover and shaker. Are you ready to shake things up?


Btw, we are planning to have this worship service alfresco, outside the


SONGS, STORIES, DISCUSSION, AND LAUGHTER WITH PAUL BAKER HERNANDEZ

This photo/video illustrated talk by O. Don Hermes, Prof. Emeritus University of Rhode Island and lifelong geologist, will emphasize the beauty and wonders of two of the most famous national parks. Yellowstone is our first park and contains more geysers than any place on earth. It also has widespread volcanic rocks and is the site of one of the world's super volcanoes, leading to three of the largest volcanic eruptions in recorded earth history. Then, of course the wildlife is abundant, and wild.

The Tetons record a fantastic alpine glacial history reflected in their beautiful, majestic mountain peaks. What a way to appreciate the glories of our natural earth.

SK Budget Referendum 6/6

An all-day Budget Referendum will be held on Tuesday, June 6th to vote on a petition to reduce the Town's Property Tax Transfer to the School Fund by \$1.5 million.

Voting will take place at the Community Recreation Center, 30 St. Dominic Road in Wakefield. The polls will be open from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM for those electors in the Town of South Kingstown qualified to vote in this Budget Referendum on one (1) petition to amend the Town Council's Final Budget adopted for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

Voters will either approve the Town Council's Adopted Budget, OR approve the petition to reduce the School Fund by \$1.5 million.

May Mission: Earthquake Relief for Turkey & Syria

This month we are partnering with our United Church of Christ (UCC) brothers and sisters to support the relief effort in response to the devastating 7.8 earthquake that shook the border region of Syria and Turkey on February 6th 2023. Much money has been pledged by the international community, but aid money has been slow in coming, and survivors are in desperate need of basic human necessities. This area was already vulnerable due to a prolonged refugee crisis and stresses caused by the ongoing war in Syria.

The UCC 's humanitarian relief organizations, Global Ministries and Global H.O.P.E. (Humanitarian. Opportunities. Progress. Empowerment.) are responding directly, as well as partnering with the ACT Alliance which is active in the region. They are currently providing food, blankets, medicine, clothing, and shelter in response to the immediate needs of those displaced. 


