# TABITHA SUPPORTS OUR COMMUNITY

We serve people every week whose need exceeds their ability to pay and who are happy to gain new-to-them clothing and shoes. We also have shoppers who contribute



the full "ticket price" or more for items, knowing that we reinvest the funds in the church and our missions, and to support community partners.

We are reinvesting the money raised to support social services in our community – such as the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, Church World Service Kits, Peace Dale Dinner Table, Gratitude Tree w Jonnycake Center, Tri County Community Action Agency, and Youth LGBTQ Closet (Youth Pride RI).

#### **December Mission of the Month: Peace Dale Dinner Table**

On February 19, 2025, the Peace Dale Dinner Table celebrated our 11<sup>th</sup> anniversary of operation. With our numbers at the Dinner Table continuing to increase, this is a perfect time for the Dinner Table to have been selected as the Mission of the Month.

We are currently preparing more than 250 meals each Wednesday. Our increase reflects a continued statewide trend of more people seeking food assistance. A recent report by the Rhode Island Community Food Bank states that 38% of all households within the state are considered food insecure – having difficulty affording adequate food – an increase of 11 percentage points over last year, due to rapid cost increases in rent, utilities, transportation, childcare and health care, and basic annual expenses.

At the Dinner Table, we serve more than 270 meals per week to our neighbors in need, children and their families, those alone, and those hungry. That computes to over 24,000 meals per year.

In addition to Wednesday delivery/pick-up meals, we reintroduced a Tuesday sit-down meal "The Bistro" for food and community; we are welcoming 35 diners each Tuesday to this community dinner.

Our crew of more than 150 incredible volunteers do the work that makes this mission possible! Thus, donors know that every cent they give, goes to the purchase of food and materials needed to prepare meals to feed people.

Deep thanks to all the volunteers who make this mission possible: the bakers, the drivers, the baggers, the runners, the servers, those who package and pick up the bread, the dishwashers, the chefs and cooking crews, the reservation takers, the driving coordinator and our volunteer organizer.

Without the generosity of all who donate financially to our church's premier mission, the Peace Dale Dinner Table would not exist. Thank you for your continued generous support.

## **January Mission of the Month: Domestic Violence Resource Center**

We begin the new year by supporting a critical organization in our community as our mission of the month. The Domestic Violence Resource Center of South County is a non-profit making an important difference in the lives and futures of many individuals and families here in South County.

#### From their webpage:

"The Domestic Violence Resource Center of South County (DVRCSC) is a nonprofit agency that works toward a future free of violence, and to build a community in which each individual shares the responsibility to create a culture of safety and personal dignity.

"We work collaboratively to offer safety, support, advocacy, education and a network of services to the residents of Washington County. The DVRCSC is dedicated to both preventing and responding to domestic violence by working to change the social conditions, beliefs, and social actions that perpetuate abuse."

DVRC provides a comprehensive range of services for victims of domestic violence and their children, including a confidential Safe Home, Transitional Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing units, a Helpline & Drop-In Center, Support Groups, One-on-One Counseling and Court Advocacy.

All services – residential, counseling, court advocacy – are provided free of charge to all clients regardless of their financial situation. Gifts allow DVRC to continue this life-saving work by directly assisting clients and their children who are experiencing domestic violence.
