### March Mission of the Month: Egg-a-Day - Haiti



A chance meeting on the flight back from Haiti to New York after Hurricane Sandy led two women to discover a common concern: the hungry children they had seen during their visit.

By the time the plane landed, the two had vowed not only to find a way to feed the children but were determined to find a way to help the Haitians in the communities they serve become self-sufficient and produce their own food. That was the birth of the Egg-a-Day Nutrition Program (formerly known as OneEgg Haiti) which has, since 2013, provided high-quality animal protein in the form of a hard-boiled egg to over 2500 children throughout Haiti. The goal is to make the program sustainable by educating individuals, especially school children, about how to raise their own food and chickens.

That had been happening, for the most part, until a few years ago when the already poverty-stricken country was plunged into chaos with the assassination of their president. Now, dangerous gangs control much of the country making it even more difficult to find or purchase food. But UCC contacts still have a few chicken farms and are able to deliver eggs to some schools and orphanages.

Egg-a-Day is funded by donations from churches and individuals in our conference. For several years,

those donations were supplemented by additional financial support from OneEgg.org, a charitable organization that ran a similar program in Africa. However, that organization is no longer in operation. Egg-a-Day relies solely on donations from individuals and churches. It does not take much - \$60 will feed a child an egg a day for one year.

### **Having It My Way – Making Life Decisions**

Church Family Life is sponsoring "Having It My Way – Making Life Decisions" a 7-session series that will help us to prepare for our last 2 phases of life. Each session is about 1.5 hours long. Topics include finances, estate planning, mental and physical health, living environment, end of life decisions and spiritual considerations with funeral planning. Come to the sessions that meet your needs. Try to make the 1st one with a wonderful overview.

The first session **Wednesday, March 13th at 6:30pm** will be "8,000 Days" and led by Jim Blackerby. The message assumes many people are now likely to live well into their 80s – and that our lives can be divided into four periods of about 8,000 days each: 1) Birth to College Graduation (22 yr.); 2) College Graduation to

Midlife (age 44); 3) Midlife to Retirement (age 66) and 4) From Your Retirement Party Forward.

All programs will be open to the public so bring relatives and friends. Each session will include a presentation and a questions/answer segment. A full schedule with dates and times will be forthcoming.
