The Median RI home sale price has increased 76% in the last 6 years.

Unfortunately, this doesn't bode well for our state. [A recent article](#) in the Providence Journal states studies have consistently demonstrated that "adequate housing enhances educational achievement, health and civic engagement, and it is critical that we remember that it is the linchpin upon which all other economic engines rely. Common sense tells us that without housing options, a stable work force cannot exist." Summer Festival


July 31 (rain date-Aug. 7) 10am-3pm

PEACE DALE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH SOLAR PROJECT UPDATE July 1, 2021

We will use this space to provide congregation members, and interested individuals, with monthly updates on the solar panel project and member contribution participation.

Panel Installation:

SolPower, a solar company based out of Charlestown, RI has been contracted to manage the project and install the panels.

The total cost of the project is \$113,852

The project is presently in the permitting phase and under review by National Grid.

The expected start date for construction is September 2021.

Pledges and Contributions:

The state grant for \$35,292 has been approved.

The net cost to the church is \$78,560. The initial capital for the project will be borrowed from the endowment. The loan will be repaid by contributions from the church members and interested parties.

To date the church has received actual contributions of \$44,131 from 34 contributors.

Additional pledges of \$20,000.

Total from actual contributions, pledges and state grant: \$99,423

If no further gifts are received the endowment loan will be owed \$14,429.

Whatever amount is not paid by contributions will be paid out of the church budget, applying the annual utility cost savings of approximately \$14,000. To date \$64,000 is contributed or pledged. So \$14,429 will be paid back over six years, or about \$2,400 per year. The remaining \$11,600 annual savings will be applied to the church operations.

We are aware that there are two members who have contracted SolPower to install solar panels on their home. SolPower has committed to contribute \$300 per installation to the church project for any project signed by August 31, 2021 that is a referral from the church. Remember that a \$500 donation will allow you to name a panel in someone's name. This will be reflected on a plaque in the church.

If you have not yet contributed or pledged, please do so and help us to reach the goal of meeting the costs 100% from current contributions! Together we embrace our environmental mission.
